Grow Your Community, Buy Local!

Why should you consider purchasing gifts for friends and family from locally owned businesses this holiday season? It could be because buying local is the best decision you can make to support your community.

According to the Andersonville Study of Retail Economics, a local business generates 70 percent more local economic activity per square foot than big box retail chains. So, for every \$100 spent at local businesses, \$68 remains in the local economy, compared to every \$100 spent at a chain store where only \$43 remains in the local economy or \$0 remains in the local economy if you go out of town. When shopping locally, you help create jobs, fund more city services through sales tax, invest in neighborhood improvement and promote community development.

Other studies suggest that employees of independent retailers earn about \$7,000 dollars more per year than employees of national chains. Whether this reflects a higher hourly rate or more hours worked is unclear, but the fact remains that supporting local businesses equals supporting better jobs for your friends and neighbors. Owners and employees of local business are often more helpful and appreciative. Evidence from various surveys show people receive better customer care and service from local businesses. These businesses survive by their reputation and repeat business, which means customers get a higher standard of service.

Shopping locally can also be part of what makes your community great because it preserves the community's unique culture, ecology, architecture, history, music, and art. Local businesses celebrate these features, while chains tend to follow a uniform corporate outline rather than recognizing local architecture and traditions. Also your purchasing choices can impact the prosperity of our community since local businesses are consistently more generous in their support of local charities, schools, and community events. So supporting local shops essentially means that you are contributing to your community.

In an effort to help our local businesses promote shopping local, TCT will launch the Shop Local, by TCT rewards program on November 1st. Participation is free of charge to business who are TCT Association members. Participating businesses will have a Shop Local, by TCT sticker on their storefronts and be listed on TCT's website.

How it works for Businesses:

- TCT will supply participating businesses with "Shop Local" wooden nickels.
- For every \$5 a customer spends at a participating business they will be given one wooden nickel (One nickel=\$5, two nickels=\$10 and so on).
- There will be a limit of five nickels given per customer, per visit .

How it works for Customers:

Once a customer accumulates 30 nickels they can turn them in at either of TCT's Solution Center locations in Council Grove or Abilene, to be placed in both a monthly drawing for a gift from participating businesses and a quarterly drawing for a tablet*.
